ABOUT THE CHELTENHAM CEMETERIES

Opened on 3 October 1864, the Cheltenham Pioneer Cemetery was the first general cemetery established in Melbourne's bayside and coincided with the demise of the Beaumaris Methodist Churchyard Cemetery (1855-65).

Originally named the Mordialloc and South Moorabbin General Cemetery, eight acres of land fronting Charman Road was reserved. Initially just half of the area was used. A portion of the Cemetery was later excised in the 1880s for the railway line to Mordialloc.

On 14 February 1933, the Cheltenham Memorial Park opened in Holloway (Wangara) Road with 21.9 acres, later extended to 40 acres over a number of stages between the 1940s and '80s. Land was set aside for a crematorium which was never built. The first interment occurred on 27 March with the burial of Mary Ellen Payne. There have since been over 55,000 interments.

Both the Cheltenham Pioneer Cemetery and Cheltenham Memorial Park are the final resting places of many local pioneers and identities and are places of local, state and national importance.

NOTABLE INTERMENTS

Many famous and infamous persons lie buried at the Cheltenham cemeteries. Amongst some of the notable burials are:

William Calder—Chairman of the Country Roads Board.

Ron Casey—Television and sporting personality.

Bill Williamson—Champion jockey.

Sir George Jones—Chief of Air Staff and WWI fighter ace.

Walter Rose—Founder of W D Rose Funeral Directors.

Frank Benvenuto—Victim of the gangland wars.

Sir William Fry—Local identity, soldier and politician.

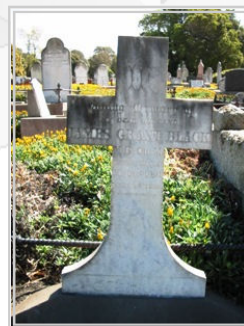
Clarice Beckett—A natural gifted realist artist.

James Legge—Commander of the AIF during WWI.

Trevor Barker—Champion Australian rules footballer.

Sir Matthew Davies—Notorious land boomer.

Vera Brown—Pioneer of infant maternal health.

DID YOU KNOW? ➤ There are three indigenous Australians buried within the cemeteries? ➤ Over 22 persons lie interred who are Knights of the British Empire? ➤ Land was excised at one of the cemeteries to make way for a railway line? ➤ Victims of some of the biggest crimes and tragic stories are interred within the burial grounds, including the Caulfield Railway disaster (1926), the Westgate Bridge collapse (1970), the Hoddle Street massacre (1987) and the HMAS *Westralia* disaster (1998)? ➤ The oldest recorded death dates back to 1852? ➤ The four burial grounds cover over 375 acres and 150,000 interments?
